

Both Sides Express Optimism After High Court Declines to Stay GHG Rule

Following the Supreme Court's rejection to stay the EPA's power plant greenhouse gas rule while challenges proceed in a lower court, supporters and opponents alike are expressing optimism over their future litigation prospects.

Bracewell's **Jeff Holmstead** told *Inside EPA* that "knowing that there are three justices who seem to believe the rule is probably unlawful means we have to feel optimistic" about a possible scenario in which critics appeal an adverse decision by the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit.
