

Bracewell Secures Another Victory for The John M. O'Quinn Foundation

HOUSTON – The Houston Court of Appeals recently affirmed entirely the trial court's dismissal of all claims brought by Darla Lexington against the John M. O'Quinn Foundation, the sole beneficiary of famed trial lawyer John O'Quinn's estate, and others related to a prior settlement between the parties, the ownership of certain real estate and the disinterment of O'Quinn's remains. **Bracewell LLP** obtained dismissal of the claims in the trial court and obtained the win in the Court of Appeals. The Court of Appeals rejected Lexington's argument that she was O'Quinn's common-law spouse or that she owned the real estate on which O'Quinn was buried.
