NEW YORK – **Elizabeth L. McGinley**, who chairs **Bracewell LLP**'s tax department, has been honored as a 2023 Notable Woman in Law by *Crain's New York Business*.

McGinley is a leader in energy transition projects utilizing federal income tax credits, focusing on carbon capture, utilization and storage (CCUS) projects. In one notable matter, McGinley – who also advises major conventional and renewable energy industry clients on acquisitions, dispositions, restructurings, joint ventures and debt and equity investments – represents Navigator CO2 Ventures LLC in its development of one of the first large-scale, commercially-viable carbon capture projects to be developed in the United States, the Heartland Greenway.
